### Pipe Line Oil Spill-Update

#### Harbor Restrictions

1. As of 2 p.m. local time, October 8<sup>th</sup> 2021, the Captain of the Port Los Angeles – Long Beach provides the following update on waterways statuses:
2. In cooperation with local jurisdictions, Unified Command has announced that the Captain of the Port will open Newport Harbor and Dana Point Harbor to all vessel traffic on October 8<sup>th</sup> 2021 at 3 p.m. PT.
3. A safety zone will continue to cover all navigable waters within 1,000-yard radius of the M/V OCEAN GUARDING (O.N. 1238260), M/V OCEAN DEFENDER (O.N. 1242242), M/V CALIFORNIA RESPONDER (O.N. 983102) and associated salvage vessel operations. No vessel or person will be permitted to enter the safety zone without obtaining permission from the COTP or a designated representative.
4. A unified command has been established with the Coast Guard, the State of California, County of Orange, and the Responsible Party.
